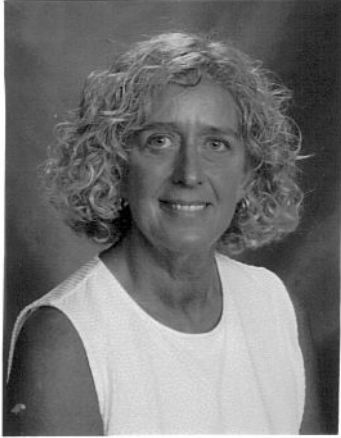


Jill Woerner, Program Chair, earned a B.A. in Secondary Spanish Education from Purdue University and an M.A. in Educational Administration and Leadership from Anderson University in Indiana. She teaches Spanish and World Language at Pendleton Heights Middle School. She was named the 2010 Teacher of the Year by the Indiana Network for Early Language Learning and the Indiana Foreign Language Teachers Association. In 2006-2007, Jill represented the high school level during the development of the Indiana Academic Standards. She has been a reviewer for FLAP grants and teacher education programs in Indiana. Jill created a four-week home-stay immersion study abroad experience in Costa Rica for high school students and accompanied the students from 2006-2009. She has been an active volunteer for the American Field Service (AFS) sending students all over the world for short and long-term language immersion programs. Through her affiliation with AFS, Jill has taken middle school students on a home-stay, immersion program in Panama and has recently traveled to Cairo, Egypt as a flight chaperon. Jill has served as the Indiana AATSP Treasurer and Webmaster as well as a leader of the revision of the *Concurso Académico*, the annual Spanish Competition.
